COURSE NEWS

Green speed is 10.5 feet.

Editors Note – if you've ever wonder exactly what this means, wonder no more!! Below is an explanation on what it means and how this is measured.

You may have notice in the greens there are some funny brown/red spots, this is a disease called Fusarium. It's a typical winter disease, that affects grasses in cool weather.

This week instead of turfing it was a change to disease prevention. The greens were sprayed with a contact fungicide on Tuesday and followed by Iron on Thursday. The reason we sprayed the Iron this time was not only for the colour, but to harden the turf to increase its resistance and reduce disease.

Once this was done we also got out and cored some more fairways.

Next week we will plan to core at least 6 fairways and we will be doing some bunker maintenance on the 8th hole.

How does Rohan measures green speed at Coringa?

The test for measuring green speed is standardised across all clubs (the Stimp meter test). It involves rolling a golf ball down a 1m metal strip at a 20% gradient and seeing how fair the ball rolls out (the distance the ball rolls is the feet measurement Rohan talks about – the further the ball rolls, the faster the greens).

At Coringa, Rohan does this on the 18th green. He has four positions on the green, all fairly flat. The four different locations are at different angles etc to allow for wind speed or slight differences in grass growth at each location (though he always uses the same four locations so the measurement is consistent week to week).

At each location, he rolls three balls and takes the average distance.

He then averages the average of the four locations to get the most accurate measurement of the green speed.

TUESDAY CREW

Confusing the Tuesday team meet on Monday and spent a frosty morning clearing the popular branches left on the edge of the 16th fairway where the big popular trees were pulled down last week.

There is another days work doing a similar job on the edge of the 17th tee – we plan to do this next Monday also.

We have offered IGQ the use of our Clubrooms that morning and Richard Kingsbury will be welcoming the delegation to our Club.

There will be a number of visitors around the Club that day but the course is open for play as usual.

Note. It may still be a little bit darker depending on cloud cover, so by booking in at this earlier time, you must do so knowing that you will be required to tee off on time, even if this means the first couple of shots might be made in low light conditions.

Same day tee bookings now available on-line

Dotgolf has made a small change to our booking system, which allows you to make a booking for the same day and see on-line what the bookings at the course that day.

Previously this was unavailable, so if you wanted to add, remove or alter a booking on the day, you needed to call the pro-shop. You can now do this yourself, from your computer or phone.

After Round 6 we see a switch in the first two positions, with Matt Vieceli (16.520) taking over the lead after improving his overall net score by 3.920 to be on 50.480, heading off last weeks leader Andy Williamson (16.600) who improved on his net score by 1.960, to now be on 52.400. Keith Yardley (24.780) continues to hold onto third spot with a net score of 53.483, followed by Chris Choie (16.840) who improved 7 places to be in fourth spot on 55.160. The most significant movers this week were Lloyd Bell (15.500) moving up 13 places to eleventh spot on 56.500 and Gordon McCoy (22.333) up 17 places to thirtieth on 59.667.

There are no competitors who are currently over net par, with all players now under the net score of 67, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the range of net scores in the field compresses.

There were another 18 new birdies or better recorded last week, bringing the total to date of 118, with Matt Vieceli (16.520) carding his second eagle in this Winter ringers competition on Hole # 4 off the Blue tees, an impressive feat. Mal Ashton (8.033) continues to hold the lead in these statistics with a tally of 1 eagle and 8 birdies, followed by David Harvey (8.100) with 8 birdies then Matt Vieceli with 2 eagles and 3 birdies, with Albert Yee (7.800) with 7 birdies, followed by Jesse Guise (13.520) and Spencer Wicks (5.483) with 6 birdies each.

There are 9 players so far, to have to registered par or better on every hole. Those still to have a single bogey to discard on their scorecards are Matt Vieceli (16.520) on Hole # 17, Andy Williamson (16.600) on Hole # 4, Chris Choie (16.840) on Hole # 10, Mal Ashton (8.033) on Hole # 3, David Cross (15.400) on Hole # 13, Lex Halford (10.883) on Hole # 2, Albert Yee (7.883) on Hole # 9, Graeme Free (10.550) on Hole # 6, Mike Arlidge (11.175) on Hole # 17 and Kyle Charlwood (10.133) on Hole # 18.

The only hole yet to have a birdie registered, continues to be Hole # 15 and Hole # 2 was finally conquered again with Andy Williamson (16.600) attaining the only birdie on the hole by the Ringers field.
