# **MIXED TEES – This Saturday**

A reminder how this works,

The course is made up from a combination of Black, Blue and Yellow tees.

Print your card as per normal, selecting "mixed tees" option

While you are on the course you will need to check your card to know which tee block is to be used for each hole.

Example; b = Black, u = Blue, y = Yellow

Here is the layout of the holes.

The course has been rated through dotgolf, so all scores count towards handicapping, and for the shootout.

This is intended as a fun alternative to the usual playing options, so nobody needs to feel intimidated by the thought of playing the Black Tees, if you look closely, you will see there are only two holes that present a more significant challenge than you are used to, holes 8 and 14.

Overall, the Mixed course is only 300m longer than the White/Silver options.

The Silver tees option will be available to those who are not ready to give the mixed tees a try. The Best Gross competition will be off the mixed tees.
