Obituary – Graham Norquay

We are very saddened to hear the shock news that Graham passed away on Saturday morning. Graham was a long-time member and supporter of Coringa, with many years dedicating his life, time and resources to the club. He has also served on the Board over the years, putting a large amount of work and effort into helping Coringa stay afloat through the tougher times.

I have only known Graham in his later years, he was the most kind-hearted gentle soul, he had a wonderful sense of humor and a deep appreciation for a good bottle of wine,

He often joked about his son David, he would show off about all his kids, telling us how successful they had become, except for David who was the "family disappointment", David chose a path in the golf world, starting off as an assistant trainee at Coringa; going on to become the head Pro. And over the years developed as a global golfing instructor, becoming the Training Director of Leadbetter Golf Academy in China.

We knew Graham was only joking, re – "family disappointment" there was no hiding the pride he had for his family.

All our love and thoughts are with his wife Sandra, son David, and all Grahams family during this sad time.

David Bruce has been one of Grahams closest friends for many years, and he gave me a small snippet to share with the club.

Graham had a vision for junior golf. He changed Canterbury golf and introduced junior golf tournaments over school holidays. Even paying for prizes himself. He just loved that involvement. Both of us had great pleasure in the 90's taking Coringa's juniors away on tours to improve their golf. So many of them ended up playing for Canterbury. Graham was always so passionate about everyone's golf in his very quiet fashion.

After Round 8 we see that Andy Williamson (16.513) continues to lead the field, his overall net score increased by 0.017 as a result of a change in his average handicap index, to be on 52.488. Graeme Falloon (25.288) moves up 2 places into second spot with his net score of 52.713. Chris Choie (16.900) improves 2 places into third spot on 53.100, followed by Keith Yardley (24.517) who drops 2 places to be in fourth spot on 53.483. The most significant movers this week were Lloyd Bell (15.613) moving up 8 places to nineth spot on 54.388, Alan Wicks (18.450) up 17 places to lie in tenth on 54.550, Gordon McCoy (22.060) moving up another 9 places to be in twelfth on 54.940, Richard McCaskill (23.957) up 10 places to be in thirteenth on 55.043 and Greg Carr up 15 places to be in fourteenth on 55.075.

There are no competitors who are currently over net par, with all players now under the net score of 66, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the range of net scores in the field compresses.

There were another 11 new birdies or better recorded last week, bringing the total to date of 143. Mal Ashton (7.925) continues to hold the lead in these statistics with a tally of 1 eagle and 9 birdies, followed by David Harvey (8.100) with 9 birdies then with Albert Yee (8.014) with 7 birdies, followed by Jesse Guise (13.433), Lex Halford (11.071), Isaac Preece (6.013) and Spencer Wicks (5.463) with 6 birdies each.

There are 14 players so far, to have to registered par or better on every hole. Those still to have a single bogey to discard on their scorecards are Andy Williamson (16.529) on Hole # 4, David Cross (15.525) on Hole # 13, Albert Yee (8.014) on Hole # 9, Mike Arlidge (11.175) on Hole # 17 and Kyle Charlwood (10.157) on Hole # 18.

The hardest ranked hole determined by the numbers of birdies or better carded, continues to be Hole # 15, the only hole yet to have a birdie registered on it. The next hardest are holes are Hole # 2, Hole # 5 and Hole # 9, each with 3 birdies recorded by the Ringers field. The easiest holes has been Holes # 1 & # 14 with 15 birdies by different players.

After the end of July, we'll see the participants divided into three groups, with the lowest handicappers in a smaller group. Please remember that the groups remain dynamic and is based on your average handicap index calculated on all qualifying rounds you've played to date.

there is no entry fee, you just sign up on qualifying day. For our new members this is a great way to meet other members, and a fantastic way to gain some match-play experience, previous experience is not required, only your participation.

Our carry over champs from 2023 are Hugh Little and Seamus O'Cromtha.

- Match-play on handicap,
 - The lowest handicapper in the group goes back to zero, and all other players adjust accordingly
 - Eg, John 11, Murray 32, Pete 4 and Burt 19, Pete is the low handicapper, he goes back to zero, all other players deduct Pete's handicap from their own, so new hcps are as follows,
 - o Pete 0, Murray 28, Burt 15, John 7.
- All match-play competitors can still play in the match of the day, but you must putt out, (no gimmes)
- You must play in the match of the day if you want your ringers or shootout scores to count

We accidentally had our first women entry last year, and although it caused the match committee a little anxiety wondering how it would go, (we hadn't done it previously) it turned out to be ok. Even though they are playing off the yellow tees, the handicaps still work things out to be fair, and although hole 9 is a par 5 for the women, in match play it doesn't matter what par is, as you are playing the person, not the course.

I am so thankful for all the memories I have shared with Graham,


We haven't seen him in a while, as he wasn't able to play golf anymore,
