The tees and fairways had a tidy cut, and the GUR has been marked. With not only doing the course set up we have also had the chance to get over to the IGQ range and open up the 3 irrigation leaks. Unfortunately these are not finished yet as we are have problem of draining the water out of the pipes to glue the join back together.

Next week, with the tournament over, we will be planning to raise the height of the greens mower and get the green speed back to normal of 10.5 feet and finish the water leaks.

## WINTER RINGERS

**\*\*Winter Ringers Competition\*\*Time to Join In & Have Some FUN\*\*The More, The Merrier \*\***

The Ringers competition Winter edition now has 43 registered competitors, with another 5 new entries this week, with handicap indexes between 5.50 to 30.5. If you decide to enter in the next few weeks, then any previous qualifying rounds played and recorded on the dotgolf website will be included.

This is a competition that everyone can compete in and have a fair chance of winning and it does not favour the high handicappers.

The entry fee is **\$10** and field is divided into three equal groups that are dynamic, that is the composition of each group is only finalised after completion of the last round and those with handicap indexes that border the ranges may swap between groups depending on their weekly changes in their handicap index.

Your weekly round scores will be picked up from Dotgolf website and a weekly Ringers leaderboard will be published on Facebook, the Coringa website and on the notice board in the Pro Shop.

This is the second part of a two-leg competition, competing for the annual "King of the Ringers" Trophy that was won narrowly by Isaac Preece over Drew Butcher last year.

Test your golfing prowess and beat the course hole by hole over a thirteen-week period, have some laughs and earn some bragging rights over your fellow competitors. If you're having a bad round to start with, there's always something to play for as you begin to target the remaining holes left on your scorecard to improve on your Ringers score.

Get involved, don't be the one that's missing out on all the FUN...challenge yourself and see what your lowest gross/net score could be if you had the perfect composite round. Get rewarded for your efforts.

There'll be an entry sheet on the Pro Shop counter, next to the cash register, register your name on the sheet and pay your entry fee to Barry.

After Round 2, David Cross (15.4) overtakes the lead after moving up 7 places with a net score of 59.600, slightly ahead of Michael J Smith (20.3) who moved up 7 places with a net score of 60.750, followed by Graeme Falloon (26.2) in third spot on 60.800. The most significant movers this week were Andrew Wight (24.5) moving up 16 places to eighth, Robert Pryce (22.1) up 21 places to thirteenth and Brian Docherty (12.4) up 14 places to fifteenth.

There are only five competitors who are currently over net par but with another 11 rounds to play, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the range of net scores in the field compresses.

There were another 30 new birdies or better recorded last week, bringing the total to date of 49, with David Harvey (8.1) and Spencer Wicks (5.5) leading this statistic with a tally of 4 birdies each, followed by Jesse Guise (13.8), Lex Halford (10.8), Ram Thapa (11.3) and Albert Yee (7.9) with 3 birdies.

Those with two birdies are David Cross (15.4), Michael J Smith (20.3), Mike Arlidge (11.7), Malcolm Wratt (9.4), Scott Calvert (14.2), Mal Ashton (8.3) and Lloyd Bell (14.7) with two birdies each. We're still awaiting the first eagle to be recorded by the field after a record breaking Summer edition.

The only holes yet to have birdies registered are holes # 6 and hole # 15 and Holes # 2, # 5 and #9 are the only holes without multiple birdies recorded on them.

2. **Trialists are required to complete a minimum of 5 rounds. Those who complete 6 rounds will be averaged over 6 rounds.**
3. Automatic selection is awarded to the first 6 past the post.
4. Selectors reserve the right to exercise 'Selector's choice' for the remaining 2 spots.
5. 3 Reserves will be announced too - **Reserves are free to be released to play other events, but Blank Cup obligations remain their priority even if it is a last-minute call-up.**
6. Anyone who withdraws before completing a full trial round due to poor play will receive a score of 99!
7. Trialists are expected to team up so they may score each other's cards—otherwise, the election of a non-trialist scorer is subject to the selector's prior approval.
8. No gimme putts, as the Trial forms part of the Saturday competition. 2 stroke penalty for those in breach.

He talked about his role as President and outlined his vision for Canterbury Golf, which included improving communication with the clubs. He also talked about the 'She loves golf' program and how there have been 400 ladies pass through this program but only 10% have joined clubs. They are looking into ways they can assist these ladies to consider joining a club.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Speaker was Kevin Gwatkins from the Canterbury Referees Assoc. he talked about the importance of all golfers knowing the rules, and recommended that you download the App .

John Hillary on the 3<sup>rd</sup> hole.

1st shot. Tops the Tee shot which bobbles along the ground hits the 2-inch white OB post which advances it back into play. 2nd shot low hook under the trees which flies through the green somehow missing the 4 players putting, splitting them perfectly. 3rd shot chips back onto the green and holds a lovely par putt.

I wouldn't worry too much John, it's not your fault, Stupid things tend to happen when Johnny McKay is around. He's contagious.

### **Golf Rule**

Here is an interesting rule I never knew, (the part highlighted) it was sent to me by someone who is very likely to need it at some point, Thanks Al Smith.

**GOLF RULE - Use of equipment: Tees and other devices**

When playing a ball from the teeing area, a player may place a ball on a tee for the stroke, but there is no compulsion to actually use a tee.

The rules do not specify that the "tee" must be either wooden or plastic either.

The definition simply refers to "an object" used to raise the ball above the ground.

Presumably it could be metal, but that would probably cause unnecessary damage to the club during the stroke.

It can also simply be a raised indentation made with a club or foot, which Laura Davies does when teeing off.

However, the rules specify that the tee must not:

- be longer than 101.6mm ( 4 inches)
- be designed or manufactured in such a way that it could indicate the line of play
- unduly influence movement of the ball, or
- otherwise assist the player in making a stroke

Tees may be tethered together, or to an anchor ( such as a pitch repairer) provided that nothing is used to help with line or making the stroke.

Although a tee may only be used in the teeing area, there may be occasions when the tee is subsequently used for the 2nd or 3rd stroke on that hole e.g.

- playing a ball after taking the stroke and distance penalty ( whether voluntarily or compulsorily)

- playing a stroke after the first tee shot, when the ball has either not left the teeing area at all e.g. an air shot; a very short one, or has ricocheted back into the teeing area and is now at rest.

In any of these scenarios there is no penalty for moving the ball, putting it back on a tee, or moving it to another part of the teeing area.

So if you hit your ball, but it stays within the teeing area, you may re-tee the ball anywhere inside the tee box.

But surely, this is absurd, it would never happen, would it?
