CLUB NEWS

COURSE REPORT

Green speed as of Wednesday is 10.5 feet.

As mentioned in the newsletter two weeks ago, there is a bit of disease getting into the greens. Unfortunately, with the weather conditions last weekend, overcast damp days, this is prefect conditions for the disease.

The greens were sprayed Monday morning with a mixture of two fungicides. This should stop the disease and give us about 21 days cover, but we will still keep a close eye on it. With the disease hanging around, we are putting in the work program what we call a physical control of the disease which means if we do not mow, we will remove any dew so that the greens dry as fast as possible, so the disease does not take over.

Apart from the work on the greens, we have started coring tees (may not finish this week) and fixed the irrigation leak behind the 10th tee. This leak was a bit of a mission as it was one of the low points

of the course and we had to drain the whole irrigation system, which took two whole days. We also trimmed around all tee sprinklers.

Next week we plan to do more moving and to continue with re-turfing.

Nothing much to report with the bad weather Tuesday cancelling any work around the course, but the team will be back next week – first job is tidying up the gardens around the back of the cart shed

Trial Rules -

- 1. Gross score less ESC's (adjusted scores) tracked. The ultimate average score determines the final ranking.
- 2. Trialists are required to complete a minimum of 5 rounds. Those who complete 6 rounds will be averaged over 6 rounds.
- 3. Automatic selection is awarded to the first 6 past the post.
- 4. Selectors reserve the right to exercise 'Selector's choice' for the remaining 2 spots.
- 5. 3 Reserves will be announced too Reserves are free to be released to play other events, but Blank Cup obligations remain their priority even if it is a last-minute call-up.
- 6. Anyone who withdraws before completing a full trial round due to poor play will receive a score of 99!
- 7. Trialists are expected to team up so they may score each other's cards—otherwise, the election of a non-trialist scorer is subject to the selector's prior approval.
- 8. No gimme putts, as the Trial forms part of the Saturday competition. 2 stroke penalty for those in breach.
