I remember the new red electric bike (nicknamed 'Basil') kept getting blowing over in the strong Northerly winds and Bill had to buy two new two driver shafts as a consequence all in close proximity and must have cost Billy a few unexpected dollars. I also recall he was always complaining about breaking so many hand break mechanisms on the red bike.

Bill loved nice things, whether it was clothing, wine / alcohol or vehicles. He was particularly proud of his immaculate silver Audi A6 station wagon. A vehicle he had started to use again recently.

He loved a good conversation, a drink and a flutter on anything that moved. He will be sadly missed by many of the late morning group.

The family have put a notice in the paper on Wednesday indicating that there would be a private funeral on Friday for Bill and a celebration of his life to be held at the Papanui Club Thursday next week from 4.00 p.m.


Unfortunately, this week with the over sowing we haven't cut much grass but next week its a full wire to wire cut and also the over sowing of the tees
