CLUB NEWS

BOARD UPDATE

The Board met on Monday and there were a few things discussed that we felt were worth updating the Club on.

- 1. Rohan took us through the results of the recent soil tests conducted on the greens by Living Turf. They show positive trends over the last 12 months on the key markers, particular PH levels and organic material. Both metrics are heading in the right direction, which reflects what we are all seeing each week. As you can imagine, it was a relatively easy decision to continue with the Living Turf fertiliser program for the next twelve months not only are the results great, by having targeted fertiliser program based on soil tests we are actually applying less nitrates and other chemicals to our course.
- 2. We talked through a course reseeding proposal. Basically, this involves over reseeding (or overseeding) the key areas of our course (fairways, tees, surrounds) each year (initially a 5 year program). This will promote stronger, denser grass growth in all these areas (ideally something we should be doing regularly but to the best of our knowledge, hasn't been done since the course was established).

After some discussion it was decided to proceed with this (including buying the new seeding machine). It costs a bit of money, just over \$25k for the new seeding machine and roughly \$10k in seed each year (hence the discussion!!), but we think this is an exciting step forward for the Club – we've seen what a difference the coring machine, sand spreader and turf cutter have made around the place – we think over time this could do the same for our fairways and tees/surrounds.

We've ordered the machine and Rohan's hoping to put it to use this spring.

3. **Debt repayment**. We've been working hard over that last five years to clear the Club's debts. On Monday we agreed to repay the last big chunk of debt that the Club has outstanding.

Over the last six years we've paid (or repaid) around \$500k of debt and interest, with this last payment now largely clearing the Club's debts.

It's a major milestone for the Club - getting rid of the debt removes a significant issue that has always hampered our Club and takes away a whole lot of risk going forward.

[Note: full disclosure - there are still two other loans, one to NZ Govt for around \$10k and one to IGQ for just over \$40k, however we aren't looking to repay either of these early – the NZ Govt loan is relatively cheap money at 3% interest and the IGQ loan is being offset against lease payments, so both of these we will just let them wind out over the next couple of years.

COURSE NEWS

Green speed is 10.5 feet (funny how quick we all get use to faster greens – the comments we hear regularly now is how the greens are little slower than people are use too!!)

This week the focus was on maintenance and preparing for the spring growth which is not far away. The greens, tees and fairway mowers all had their cutting blades replaced and sharpen and also any servicing done, all in preparation for the spring growth season.

Steve and Max were out doing some tree trimming on the cold frosty mornings and also tidying some of the old stumps down hole 6.

Big job next week is putting sand into the new bunkers on 8. We will also be giving the fairways and a bit of rough their first cut for the season.

CHANGE TO MATCH PLAY - PLAYOFF HOLE SEQUENCE

The match-committee have deliberated this week, over the current process being used for a suddendeath playoff in match-play events.

In recent years we have adapted to using holes 1 and 9 if any extra holes are required, players would continue around this loop until a winner is decided.

This was implemented approximately 5 - 6 years ago to allow competitors to stay closer to the clubhouse, and was introduced during a time when the course wasn't as busy as it is now.

However, with the sharp increase in members and green fee players playing on a Saturday, using this sequence of holes has become increasingly difficult to manage, and causes a lot of disruption to

- 1. Green fee players waiting on the first tee.
 - o Green fee players are a vital part of the club's continued success and growth,
- 2. Members having their round delayed on hole 9.
 - We already know that the later starters have a slower round, this interruption compounds the delay even more.

New Process. (This is a return to the old process)

Any extra holes required for match play events, will start at hole one, and continue in sequential order until a winner is found. Eg 1, 2, 3,

This has been done in the past, and we know it works well,

It does create a disruption to the first tee, but a single disruption is much easier to manage, than the potential for multiple disruptions.

the only downside is, you could finish a bit further away from the clubhouse then you would prefer.

Because the Urlwin Rosebowl competition is already under way, the new rule will come into effect as of Sunday 25th August. So, if there is any playoff required this Saturday, you may use the 1 – 9 loop for the final time.

WINTER RINGERS

Only 2 rounds left to play.

After Round 12, the third of five rounds for the month of August, we saw Andy Williamson (16.433) consolidate his lead over the field, his overall net score decreased by 1.978, to be on 48.567. Peter Marsh (31.075) moves up 1 place into second spot with his net score of 48.925. Robert Tibbotts (14.450) improves 7 places into third spot on 49.550 after shooting an impressive round of 76 with 4 birdies, two carded in each half of the course. He is followed by Alan Wicks (18.767) who maintains fourth spot on 50.233. The most significant movers this week were Richard McCaskill (23.673) up 3 places into fifth spot on 50.327, Kyle Charlwood (10.008) moving up 19 places to ninth spot on 51.992, Scott Calvert (13.955) up 11 places to lie in eleventh on 52.045 and Robert Pryce (22.150) up 18 places to lie in eighteenth on 52.850.

NB: Please remember that the groups remain dynamic and is based on your average handicap index calculated on all qualifying rounds you've played to date.

There are no competitors who are currently over net par, with all players now under the net score of 66, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the range of net scores in the field compresses.

There were another 24 new birdies or better recorded last week, bringing the total to date of 203. Mal Ashton (7.882) continues to hold the lead in these statistics with a tally of 1 eagle and 11 birdies, followed by Kyle Charlwood (10.008) who scored an impressive eagle with his approach shot on Hole # 9 and has 9 birdies to his name. David Harvey (8.273) is next with 10 birdies, followed by Robert Tibbotts (14.450) with 9 birdies. Any Willamson (16.433) and Scott Calvert (13.955)are next with 8 birdies each.

There are 22 players so far, to have to registered par or better on every hole. Those still to have a single bogey to discard on their scorecards are Matt Vieceli (14.467) on Hole # 17, Jesse Guise (13.450) on Hole # 13, David Cross (15.630) on Hole # 13, Tim Donaldson (11.391) on Hole # 4, Albert Yee (8.250) on Hole # 9 and Scott Calvert (13.955) on Hole # 14.

The hardest ranked hole determined by the numbers of birdies or better carded, are Holes # 2 & # 15 with only 4 birdies recorded, next is Hole # 5 with 4 birdies registered on it by the Ringers field. The easiest hole has been Hole # 12 with 24 birdies by different players. The next easiest is Hole # 1 with 23 birdies by different players, then Hole # 14 with 17 birdies.

Course Care

We are nearing the end of Winter, the days are already getting longer, and despite our recent cold snap, the weather is starting to warm up, which means it's not long before the grass starts growing like mad and the greenkeepers will be flat out trying to keep it under control.

The course has held up well over winter, but we are noticing a lot of unrepaired or very badly repaired divots out there on the fairways,

With the volume of people playing, we need everyone to do their part in looking after our course,

Repair your divots, using this preferred method,

- 1. If you have taken a large divot with a wedge or short iron, the grass heals/recovers quicker if you find the fresh divot and put it back into the hole carved out by the club. It also keeps the course much tidier.
- 2. Only if your divot has exploded into a million bits, and cannot be recovered, then you should use your sand bucket, add just enough sand to fill the hole, (do not overfill your divots)

Rake the Bunkers

I still get a lot of reports from frustrated members about the unraked footprints in the bunkers,

Everyone who plays golf is aware, if you go into a bunker, you must rake it flat when you have finished,

I'm not going to speculate on who is doing this, or not doing this. As I have personally never seen anyone not rake a bunker after they have played out of it.

The greens staff rake the bunkers every week, so please do your part, if you go into a bunker rake it when you are finished
