The big job this week was to cut the whole course but due to the weather we couldn't quite get a full cut of the rough done. So instead we have cut four laps of rough around the fairways and have done some heavily blocks of rough around the course. The rest of the course has been cut. We have had some unexpected disease get into the greens over the week and that has now been sprayed today (Thursday). The Greens and tees have had their fertilize.

Next week we will be looking at finish/tidy the back of the 17th tee block, spray around tees and fit in some irrigation work.

Nothing to report – Monday nights wild weather and the cold southerly wind meant Tuesday's working bee was cancelled (as someone pointed out – he wouldn't play golf in this weather so he wasn't going to do work on the course in it!!)

2024 FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS

Malcolm's been busy drafting up the Club's accounts for the financial year that ended 31 August 2024. There's a few final changes but the accounts are 95% complete now.

Once he's finished all this work we'll publish the accounts along with the other reports prior to the AGM in November but there are a some highlights we thought worth sharing with the members now.....

- Subscription revenue was up 10% on last year, and Green fee revenue up 25% on last year
- Total revenue was over \$1m for year the first time ever!!

- Net Profit before Depreciation is over \$250k (up \$60k on last year, and last year was a very good year)
- The Club used this money to pay off \$200k of debt, as well as buy new bits of equipment (spray unit, small ride on mower, turf cutter) and spend some money refurbing the equipment in Café/bar

As we've said in previous newsletters, the Club has now basically sorted out its historical debt issues, having paid off over \$400k in debt in the last five years.

Its been a long journey, never too sure what's around the corner and always lots of different demands on funds, but its great to know we're in such a solid financial position going forward.

We will share a full set of the accounts with all our members in the next month or so.

CAFE / BAR NEWS

As the number of members at Coringa continue to grow we experience issues that need on-going management. With record numbers joining our Saturday field we know that pressure on booking games has increased. It has also meant less opportunities for our Café/Bar staff to get a break. To help with this we have employed Fergus Lloyd, a Uni Golf member to help Bev out for a few hours on Saturday afternoon. This will give her time for a break and also an extra pair of hands for the end of day wrap.

Welcome to the team Fergus. You have fitted in really well and quickly mastered the role.

Another welcome addition to the Cade/Bar has been an on bench ice-maker. A big shout out to Janet Harland for donating this to the Club. It is working really well and will mean we will always have ice on and over the summer.

Cafe / Bar - Sunday Opening

Now we have an increased number of members and green fee players using the course on Sundays, we have asked Bev to open the Cafe/Bar over the Spring and Summer. Often we have an Interclub team playing and provide catering for them anyway. You will notice the window signs indicating the Cafe/Bar is open and also that the teardrop flags are out front.
