#### **COURSE NEWS**

Green speed is 11 feet which is really good a week out from the Canterbury 4BBB. The aim is to get the greens up to top speed for this competition to really test Canterbury's gun golfers (and show case our course).

With this week being a short week we have been busy trying to fit everything into 4 days. The greens are running okay for this time of year, and they got a bit of fertilizer to help with shade and any stress that they might have over the winter months. The turf behind the 13th green has been replaced and is looking great. The main practice area has been renovated with 18mm solid tines and top dressed with sand. It may be a little rough for a couple of weeks but needs this work to give the area a chance to regenerate.

Next week we will be doing course preparation for the Canterbury 4BBB, but we will also be looking into the water leaks over at the IGQ practice area.

#### **TUESDAY CREW**

A lovely Tuesday morning was spent mainly weeding the native plants we put in 18mths ago behind the 10<sup>th</sup> green (good news is most have survived and look like they will take off next spring). We also did a bit more in-fill planting in this area with the aim to really 'densify' it when everything grows in a couple of years.

While we were doing this Brian Docherty and Walter Scott undertook a special job – cleaning the yellow tee signs around the course, making them more visible and also straightening a few of them up (well done guys!)

Next week it will be helping Rohan with the prep for the Canterbury 4BBB comp. on the 16th June.

#### **COURSE CARE**

It's a little frustrating knowing all the effort that goes into getting the course looking great and then see its not being maintained by those using it. On Wednesday morning, Rohan and the team raked every bunker on the course before the Watering tournament. On Thursday afternoon when I played, every bunker I walked past (or was in, and that was a lot!!) had fresh, unraked foot prints, often multiple sets

Please, please, please,

- Rake bunkers
- Repair Divots (both on the fairway and in the rough)

- Repaid pitch marks on the greens

And you don't have to just restrict yourself to your footprints, divots or pitch marks - if you see something, fix it up – its your course after all.......

# **WINTER RINGERS**

\*\*Winter Ringers Competition\*\*Time to Join In & Have Some FUN\*\*The More, The Merrier \*\*

The Ringers competition started off last Saturday with the Winter edition having an initial 38 registered competitors, with handicap indexes between 0.5 to 30.5. I'm guessing that the long King's Birthday weekend affected the numbers. If you decide to enter in the next few weeks, then any previous qualifying rounds played and recorded on the dotgolf website will be included in the composition of your Ringers score.

This is a competition that everyone can compete in and have a fair chance of winning and it does not favour the high handicappers.

The entry fee is \$10 and field is divided into three equal groups that are dynamic, that is the composition of each group is only finalised after completion of the last round and those with handicap indexes that border the ranges may swap between groups depending on their weekly changes in their handicap index.

Your weekly round scores will be picked up from Dotgolf website and a weekly Ringers leaderboard will be published on Facebook, the Coringa website and on the notice board in the Pro Shop.

Test your golfing prowess and beat the course hole by hole over a thirteen-week period, have some laughs and earn some bragging rights over your fellow competitors. If you're having a bad round to start with, there's always something to play for as you begin to target the remaining holes left on your scorecard to improve on your Ringers score.

Get involved, don't be the one that's missing out on all the FUN...challenge yourself and see what your lowest gross/net score could be if you had the perfect composite round. Get rewarded for your efforts.

There'll be an entry sheet on the Pro Shop counter, next to the cash register, register your name on the sheet and pay your entry fee to Barry.

After Round 1 off the Black/White tees for the men and Yellow tees for the women, Lindsay Smith (17.3) leads the field with an impressive net score of 63.70, ahead of Murray Angus (12.7) with a net score of 67.30, followed by David Harvey (8.2) on 69.80. So at this early stage, there are only eleven competitors who are currently under net par but with another 12 rounds to play, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the range of net scores in the field compresses. There were 19 birdies or better recorded, with David Harvey (8.2) making a solid start with three birdies, followed by Malcolm Wratt (8.7) and Michael J Smith (20.5) with two birdies each, followed by twelve players with a birdie each.

#### **Trial Rules -**

- 1. Gross score less ESC's (adjusted scores) tracked. The ultimate average score determines the final ranking.
- 2. Trialists are required to complete a minimum of 5 rounds. Those who complete 6 rounds will be averaged over 6 rounds.
- 3. Automatic selection is awarded to the first 6 past the post.
- 4. Selectors reserve the right to exercise 'Selector's choice' for the remaining 2 spots.
- 5. 3 Reserves will be announced too Reserves are free to be released to play other events, but Blank Cup obligations remain their priority even if it is a last-minute call-up.
- 6. Anyone who withdraws before completing a full trial round due to poor play will receive a score of 99!

- 7. Trialists are expected to team up so they may score each other's cards—otherwise, the election of a non-trialist scorer is subject to the selector's prior approval.
- 8. No gimme putts, as the Trial forms part of the Saturday competition. 2 stroke penalty for those in breach.
