COURSE NEWS

Green speed is 10.6 feet (about the same speed as Royal Troon where the British Open is been played)

This week the big thing was fighting against the disease we have in the greens. We have been out spot-spraying trying to get on top of the disease but unfortunately, we are losing. So tomorrow (Friday) we will be spraying the greens once again straight after the mow and will not be mowing the greens until the following Friday to try give a chance for the contact fungicide to work its full magic. When we are not mowing, we will be taking the due off the greens, if it's a roll or just using a rope to remove the due so that the greens can dry as fast as possible.

Coring of the fairways is going great, and by the end of this week we will only have four more to do.

Bunker maintenance on hole 8 - well some of you would have seen what is happening on that hole. The Board and I looked at this hole a few weeks ago on a course walk and decided to make a few changes and give the hole a makeover. The changes are around the 135m marker. We will be using the existing mounds and put in 2 fairway bunkers (this was always on previous course plans but we never had the funds to make the change). Once the bunkers have been built and are in play, we will be removing the 5 trees that currently are growing around the new bunker sites (4 on the left and 1 on the right). This will be a 3–4-week project and once completed, I am sure it will make the hole.

WINTER RINGERS

After Round 7 we saw two late entries into the competition, bringing it up to 50 competitors. During the week, I was notified by a fellow contestant that there was a correction to Matt Vieceli's scorecard last week and that he did not achieve an eagle on Hole # 4 and that an input error was recorded in the processing of his scorecard by the Pro Shop. The leaderboard has now been updated and only order of the first three places were affected by the correction.

With the change, we see that Andy Williamson (16.529) continues to lead the field, his overall net score by increased by 0.071 as a result of a change in his average handicap index, to be on 52.471. Keith Yardley (24.517) moves up 1 place into second spot with no change to his net score of 53.483 from last week. Matt Vieceli (16.467) drops 1 place into third spot on 53.533, followed by Graeme Falloon (25.371) who improved 2 places to be in fourth spot on 53.629. The most significant movers this week were Lex Halford (11.071) moving up 13 places to eleventh spot on 55.929, Brian Docherty (13.104) up 12 places to thirteenth on 55.986 and Gordon McCoy (22.200) moving up 9 places on 56.800.

There are no competitors who are currently over net par, with all players now under the net score of 68, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the range of net scores in the field compresses.

There were another 14 new birdies or better recorded last week, bringing the total to date of 132, with Kyle Charlwood (10.257) carding an eagle on Hole # 12 off the Blue tees, the fourth by the Winter Ringers field. Mal Ashton (7.971) continues to hold the lead in these statistics with a tally of 1 eagle and 9 birdies, followed by David Harvey (8.100) with 9 birdies then with Albert Yee (8.014) with 7 birdies, followed by Jesse Guise (13.433), Isaac Preece (6.014) and Spencer Wicks (5.471) with 6 birdies each.

There are 10 players so far, to have to registered par or better on every hole. Those still to have a single bogey to discard on their scorecards are Andy Williamson (16.529) on Hole # 4, Chris Choie (16.917) on Hole # 10, Mal Ashton (7.971) on Hole # 3, David Cross (15.500) on Hole # 13, Vance Hetaraka (12.543) on Hole # 15, Albert Yee (8.014) on Hole # 9, Graeme Free (10.729) on Hole # 6, Mike Arlidge (11.175) on Hole # 17 and Kyle Charlwood (10.157) on Hole # 18.

The hardest ranked hole determined by the numbers of birdies or better carded, continues to be Hole # 15, the only hole yet to have a birdie registered on it. The next hardest are holes are Hole # 2, Hole # 5 and Hole # 9, each with 3 birdies recorded by the Ringers field.

After the end of July, we'll see the participants divided into three groups, with the lowest handicappers in a smaller group. Please remember that the groups remain dynamic and is based on your average handicap index calculated on all qualifying rounds you've played to date.

If you want to have a laugh, turn up this Saturday to watch this group tee off in the dark, Thanks to Spencer, lol.


Course Behavior
