SUBSCRIPTIONS

It is planned that your subscription invoices will start to be emailed out on Friday afternoon, although they could take a day or two to process all of them.

If you don't receive one, please check your spam folder, but if you are receiving this news letter, you should get your invoice.

A couple of points to be aware of;

If you pay by direct debit or auto payment, the invoice will not show payments made on or after Friday 14th Aug 24. However these will still come through normally, and of course new payments for next year will be adjusted automatically for direct debit payees.

If you continue to pay by auto payment, an admin fee will be applied later (amount yet to be set) and you will need to adjust the amount of your payments manually. We simply ask that you do so correctly to ensure your full sub is paid by the end of the golfing year, including the admin fee . As I have pointed out previously, auto payments make considerable additional work for the club, hence our encouragement to switch to direct debit.

Secondly, the Board have decided that the categories <u>Introduction 2nd Year & 3rd Year</u> are no longer available. However to soften the blow between the jump from Intro 1st Year to Full member, those existing Intro 1st year members will remain on this category for one more golfing year (at the new sub level of course). There may be some rare instances where you might be disadvantaged with this decision, is so please contact me by email to sort this out. We are very accommodating, and only want members pay the correct and fair amount.

The due date for payment of all subs (excluding direct debit payees) will be 30 Sept 2024, however we would encourage all members to pay as soon as they are able to assist the club in its finances and cash flow."

There are no competitors who are currently over net par, with all players now under the net score of 66, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the range of net scores in the field compresses.

There were another 10 new birdies or better recorded last week, bringing the total to date of 179. Mal Ashton (7.882) continues to hold the lead in these statistics with a tally of 1 eagle and 10 birdies, followed by David Harvey (8.273) with 10 birdies. Kyle Charlwood (10.073) and Ram Thapa (11.055) are next with an eagle and 6 birdies each then with Albert Yee (8.250), Scott Calvert (13.940), Jesse Guise (13.400), Lex Halford (11.289) and Isaac Preece (6.000) with 7 birdies each, followed by Robert Tibbotts (14.536), John Hillary (7.989) and Spencer Wicks (5.427) with 6 birdies each. There are 19 players so far, to have to registered par or better on every hole. Those still to have a single bogey to discard on their scorecards are Jesse Guise (13.450) on Hole # 13, David Cross (15.544) on Hole # 13, Tim Donaldson (11.367) on Hole # 4, Albert Yee (8.250) on Hole # 9 and Brian McOscar (13.678) on Hole # 2.

The hardest ranked hole determined by the numbers of birdies or better carded, is Hole # 15 with only 3 birdies recorded, next are Holes # 2, # 5 and # 9 with 4 birdies registered on them by the Ringers field. The easiest hole has been Hole # 12 with 24 birdies by different players. The next easiest is Hole # 1 with 19 birdies by different players Then Hole # 14 with 16 birdies.
